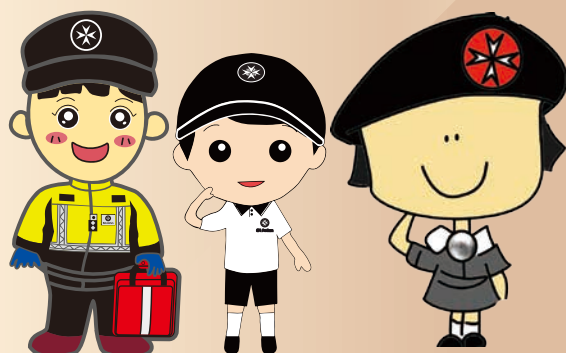

Introduction

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance has been established in Hong Kong for 141 years. It was first started in 1884 in the name of “Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Association” and inaugurated in 1900. The **Brigade** was formally established in 1916 during World War I, followed by the establishment of the **Council** in 1949 after World War II. In 2015, Hong Kong was upgraded as a **Priory** of The Order of St. John. As an ex-officio member of the Grand Council of the Order, Hong Kong ever since then has a broader scope of involvement in international policies and activities.

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance has been well-known in the provision of First Aid training and Ambulance services to the general public in Hong Kong. The principle and spirit of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance as embodied in the motto “**For the Service of Mankind**” remain unchanged after the enactment of the new **Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Incorporation Ordinance (Chapter 1164)** on 27 June 1997. Hong Kong St. John Ambulance continues in promoting and encouraging all works of humanity and charity for the relief of distress, suffering, sickness, danger and poverty without any distinction as to colour, class or creed.

The **Council** is the supreme governing body of **Hong Kong St. John Ambulance** and is charged with the governance, management and control of all businesses and activities of the Corporation. The Council is composed of dedicated volunteers from various professions and the Assistant Director (Administration and Policy) of the Department of Health also sits in the Council as an observer. The Council’s work is facilitated by its standing Committees, namely, Two MacDonnell Road Management, Finance, Honours and Awards, Public Relations, Property Management and Development, Greater China Affairs, Ambulance Service Steering and Information Technology.

The **Association**, the training branch, has been the premier organization of the territory responsible for instructing members of the general public the principles and practice of First Aid, Home Nursing and allied subjects since 1884. The **Director’s Conference** ensures that training works of the Association are conducted effectively and efficiently. There are 571 volunteer lecturers and instructors, including doctors, nurses, allied health professionals and non-professionals.

The **Brigade**, the service branch, is responsible for organizing training and equipping adult and youth members to undertake, on a voluntary basis, First Aid, Home Nursing, Ambulance and Community Services to those in need. The services are free. The **Commissioner’s Conference** is responsible for overseeing the organization, administration, services provision and development of the Brigade. At present, there are 8,052 members, made up of 3,090 Adult and 4,962 Youth members including 190 members from St. John Pandas.

Chairman's Report

Serving the community through the voluntary work of St. John Ambulance has given me great pleasure, pride and satisfaction. I would like to express my sincere appreciation and heartfelt gratitude to my fellow Members of the Council and all members of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance for their unfailing trust, valuable advice and strong support in my chairmanship, which are essential for meeting our challenges all along and ahead.

Last year marked the 140th Anniversary of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance. There were 4 remarkable events of celebration. First, a celebration dinner was held on 21 April 2024 at BP International, with the Lord Prior and Director of Health as Officiating Guests, accompanied by the Commander-in-chief and Chairman of St. John Ambulance of Malaysia. A highlight of the evening was a Memorandum of Understanding Signing Ceremony with the Guangzhou Emergency Medical Command Center. It was a successful and memorable evening. Second, the Asia Pacific Youth Competition was held on 26-30 July 2024 at the Wu Kwai Sha Youth Village of the Chinese YMCA of Hong Kong. Around 85 Cadet Members from six regions including Australia, Canada, Malaysia, New Zealand, Singapore and Hong Kong joined the competition. The Chancellor of The Order of St. John was invited to officiate at the event. The Hong Kong Team won the following awards: Overall Champion, Champion in First Aid Competition, First Runner Up in Home Nursing Competition and Best Home Nursing Team Leader Award. We are proud of the overwhelming achievements of our Youth leaders and team members. Third, the Kowloon Motor Bus Company donated a retired bus to Hong Kong St. John Ambulance under the KMB Regeneration Programme. The bus was modified as the First Aid Base of the St. John Cycle Response Unit at Nam Sang Wai. We grabbed the opportunity and honour to invite the Chancellor of The Order of St. John and the Managing Director of Kowloon Motor Bus as Officiating Guests of the Opening Ceremony on 28 July 2024. Fourth, an Ambulance Aid Manual for St. John ambulance staff and volunteers was formally published and announced to the media on 16 December 2024, as a gift to the Organization in celebrating its 140th Anniversary. This manual is the first of its kind in Hong Kong.


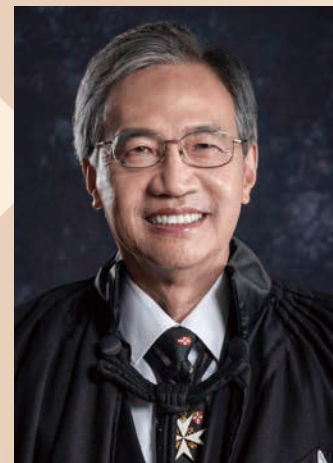
Activities and services of both the Brigade and Association have resumed to normal levels. The Brigade provided 220,860 man-hours of first aid, dental and community services, exceeding our performance pledge with the Department of Health of 170,000 man-hours annually. The overall ambulance service target was partially achieved, 10,665 emergency and 603 non-emergency (as compared with our performance pledges with the Department of Health of 7,000 emergency and 750 non-emergency). Notably, volunteers helped to provide additional ambulance service in the night shifts of Fridays, Saturdays and holiday eves from 19:30 – 07:30 hours. In view of the great demand in interhospital transfer, starting from 1 October 2024, an additional ambulance has been deployed to serve from 19:00 – 23:00 hours on every Tuesday and Thursday. This attests to our commitment **“for the service of mankind”**. The number of students trained by the Association last year was 110,089, far exceeding our performance pledge with the Department of Health of 21,000. A 4-hour Basic Life Support course was introduced by the Association on 21 September 2024 for Healthcare Providers, expanding the scope and variety of our health-related training.

Chairman's Report

Facing before us in the coming fiscal year are another 4 projects. First, with the availability of a St. John Ambulance Aid Manual, standardised and systematic Ambulance Aid training will be offered to all St. John ambulance staff and volunteers. A train-the-trainer course is in the pipeline. Hopefully, all St. John members will be trained in Ambulance Aid, in addition to First Aid and Defibrillation, upholding the image and brand name of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance, as it is the only organisation in Hong Kong using “Ambulance” in its name. Second, we are planning to set up a Macao St. John Ambulance. Consultation and liaison with interested or experienced leaders and parties, both from Hong Kong and Macao, are being actively pursued. Third, some competition events of the National Games will be held in Hong Kong in November and December this year. The Brigade and some St. John volunteers have been well prepared and looking forward to serving in these prestigious events. Finally, our Kowloon Command Headquarters Redevelopment Project has been gaining slow progress, obtaining understanding from both the Hospital Authority and the Department of Health. Certainly, the ultimate step is to have the blessing from the Health Bureau.

The achievement and success that have been made by Hong Kong St. John Ambulance would not be possible without the full dedication and commitment of our volunteers and staff, who have served conscientiously to uphold the highest tradition of St. John in every way. To them, I wish to express my sincere thankfulness and appreciation for their admirable works. In addition, the generosity and guidance of the Department of Health, Home and Youth Affairs Bureau, Hong Kong Jockey Club, The Community Chest, Sir Robert Ho Tung Charitable Fund and other donors keep us on the right track to respond to the needs of our local community, enabling the continuation and expansion of our services and works.

I am confident that St. John will grow from strength to strength and strive to provide better services for the community. Glory goes to every member of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance.

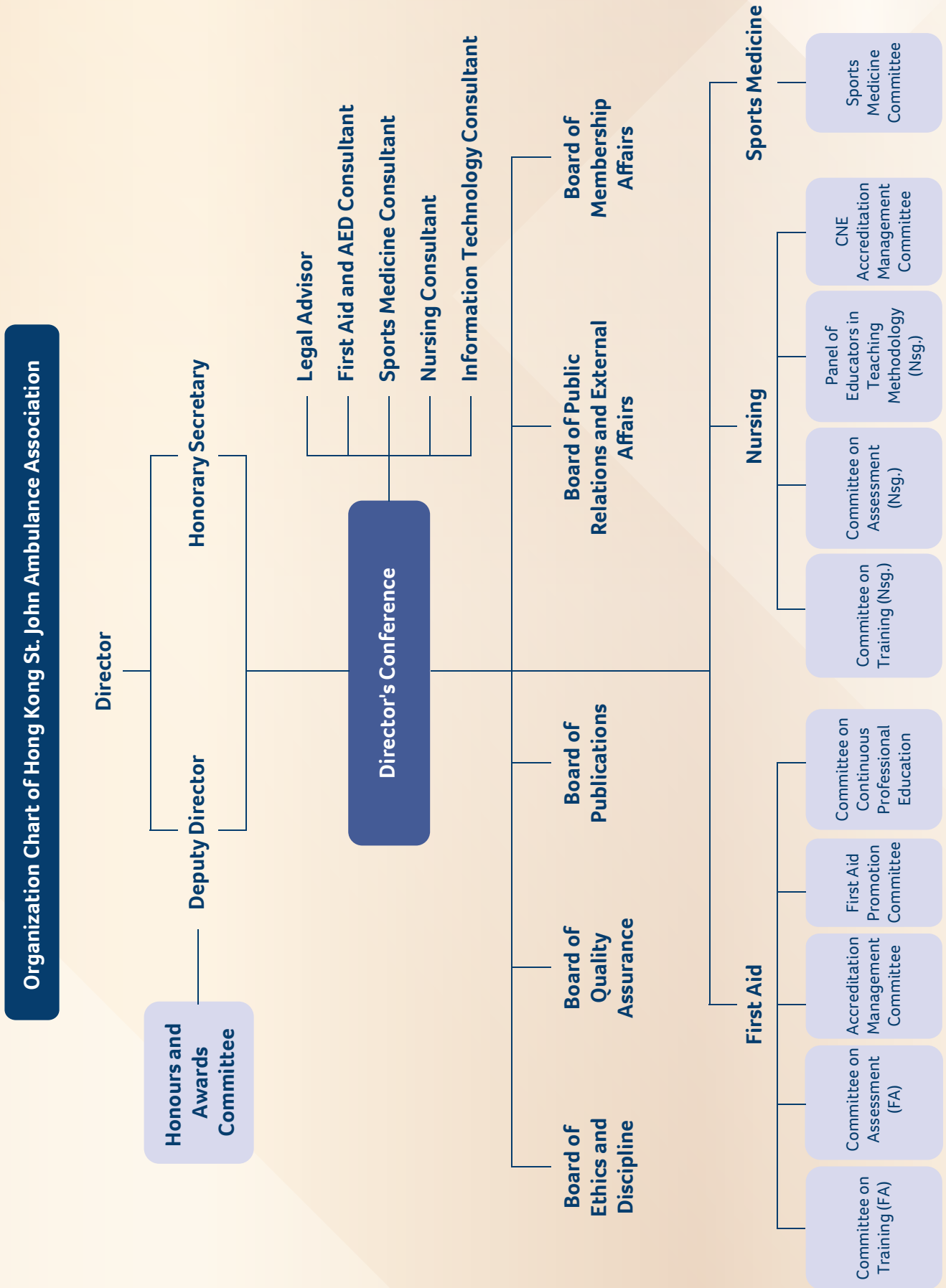

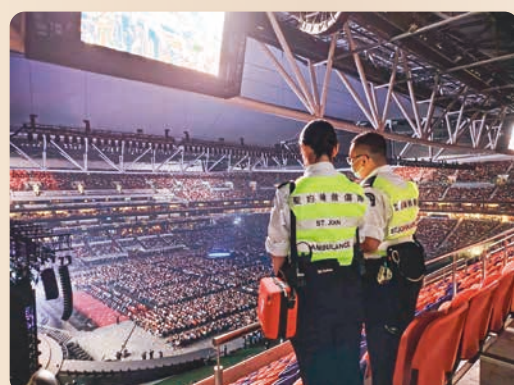
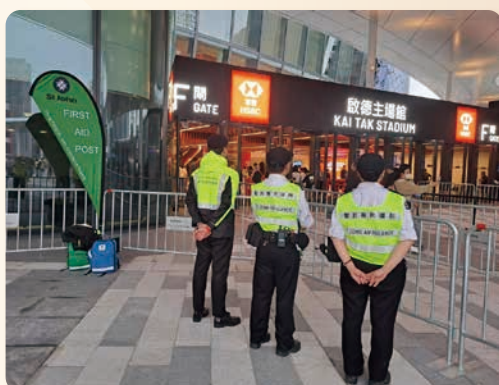
6. The **Investiture and Presentation of Prior's Commendation Ceremony** was held at St. John's Cathedral on Saturday, 16 November 2024. The Prior of The St. John Priory of Hong Kong, Dr. Chung Chin-hung presented the St. John Insignia to 19 award recipients with 1 Commander, 3 Officers and 15 Members who had been admitted to or promoted in the Order as a result of having demonstrated successfully their leadership, integrity and notable service to the organization.

In the same occasion, 1 Brigade Member received Prior's Commendation in recognition of her participation in the successful resuscitation of the life of a patient in cardiac arrest by performing Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED) during an off-duty incident on 8 January 2024.



7. First Aid Duty at Kai Tak Sports Park (KTSP)

Kai Tak Sports Park is the largest and first multi-purpose sports, entertainment and leisure precinct, providing world-class venues and facilities for major events and community enjoyment. Some test events in KTSP were held from October 2024 to March 2025 including football matches, concerts, rugby and test competitions for the National Games 2025 were also held in different stadiums in KTSP. With its official Opening Ceremony held on Saturday, 1 March 2025, St. John Ambulance Brigade was invited to deploy necessary manpower and ambulances to support the events held at KTSP since then.

8. The 15th National Games

The 15th National Games of the People's Republic of China (NG) will be held in Guangdong, Hong Kong and Macao from 9 to 21 November 2025. The 12th National Games for Persons with Disabilities (NGD) and the 9th National Special Olympic Games (NSOG) will be held from 8 to 15 December 2025. Hong Kong will stage eight competition events as well as one mass participation event for the NG and four competition events for the NGD, and one event for the NSOG and one mass participation event of para dance sport.

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Brigade has been invited to provide First Aid and Ambulance duties for all spectators during five of the competitions i.e. Handball, Golf, Triathlon, Fencing, Rugby Sevens and the mass participation event i.e. Bowling during the NG and two of the competitions i.e. Boccia, Wheelchair Fencing and the mass participation event i.e. Para Dance Sport during NGD. The Brigade will also cover 24-hour first aid standby services for the athletes' hotels during their stay in Hong Kong.

Several test events such as Golf, Triathlon, Handball, Rugby Sevens have been successfully held during November 2024 to March 2025. The Brigade has deployed more than 650 personnel and 20 ambulance shifts with a total of 5,800 service hours for the test events.



9. The **Secretary for Home and Youth Affairs' (SHYA) Commendation Scheme** aims to commend individuals for their long-term dedication towards the training and development of youths in Uniformed Groups (UGs), distinguished community services, or support to the promotion of culture and sports. There were two types of awards, namely the “UG Volunteer Leader (UGVL)” and “UG Youth Volunteer Leader (UGYVL)” presented to selected nominees with distinguished performance from the local Uniformed Groups (UGs) under the administration of the Home and Youth Affairs Bureau.

In 2023, Superintendent Francis Tso Chi-to of the Youth Command was awarded the UGVL, whereas Assistant Superintendent Tong Shau-ching and Ambulance Officer Au Hiu-ling were awarded the UGYVL in recognition of their outstanding and continuous contribution in youth services through the Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Brigade Youth Command. The Presentation Ceremony was held on Saturday, 31 August 2024.

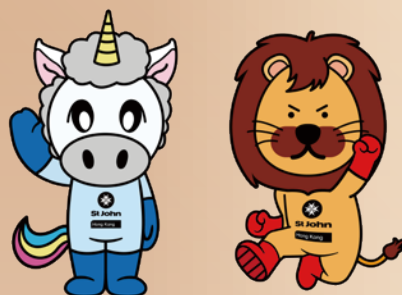

12. St. John Mascots

A lion and a unicorn have been designed as Hong Kong St. John Ambulance's Mascots to enhance the public image of the organization. In order to increase the awareness of the public on the mascots, a naming contest competition has been held in March 2025.



13. Re-Certification of ISO 9001:2015 (Certificate No. FS 708014)

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance was awarded Certificate of Registration ISO 9001:2015 in February 2020 with the scope "The provision of training services of Certificate in First Aid, Automated External Defibrillation Provider and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation courses at St. John Tower".

From 2020 onwards, St. John follows the international quality management system and operates a Quality Management System which complies with the requirement of ISO 9001:2015 of the same scope.

In January 2025, St. John has continually achieved the objectives of ISO 9001:2015 requirements in the assessment conducted by British Standards Institute (BSI). The ISO certification demonstrates that the courses and services of St. John meet the global standards of quality management systems.



14. Qualification Framework Level 3

The "Certificate in First Aid" has been accredited by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications as QF Level 3 since 2015. This recognition underscores the program's quality and its alignment with the Qualifications Framework, ensuring that it meets established educational standards. The Association has successfully passed the course review, meeting the claimed objectives and qualification levels with a validity period till 30 September 2025.



Service Reports

1. During the reporting year, the Brigade discharged a total of 220,860 man-hours of volunteer first aid, ambulance duties, dental and community services for the public.
2. In 2024/2025, the Brigade responded to 11,268 emergency and non-emergency calls for ambulance services. A detailed breakdown of these calls is tabulated below for easy reference.

3. Extra Ambulance Service (EAS) by Brigade Volunteers

Upon the review with Operations Commands, the Extra Ambulance Service (EAS) has been regularized and to be carried out continuously with effect from 1 January 2025. In addition to the existing one for every Friday, Saturday & Holiday Eve from 1930hrs to 0730hrs, extra ambulances run solely by Brigade volunteers would also be deployed on every Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 1900hrs to 2300hrs to further enhance the service and echo to the needs of the community.

4. Buccal Swab Sampling Duty for Immigration Department

In response to the invitation from the Immigration Department to assist in clearing the backlog of Buccal Swab Sampling due to the pandemic, Brigade volunteers were deployed to undergo training and conducted around 470 nos. of sampling in the Immigration Department Headquarters from March to April 2025. A team of 7 St. John personnel from Hong Kong Island, Kowloon, New Territories and Training Commands had been formed to assist this special task.

5. Dental Service

The dental service provided by Hong Kong St John Ambulance Brigade has been in operation for over 74 years.

Free dental service is made available to the elderly and patients with special needs by Brigade volunteer dentists, dental surgery assistants and members at the Dental Clinic located at the St. John Headquarters or elderly homes by the Outreach Team. In addition, oral health services are provided to the public through campaigns and special events.

In 2024/2025, volunteers in the Dental Command provided dental services to a total of 468 patients with 1,006 cases being treated in the dental clinic and 390 members of the public received oral hygiene education and free consultation during the outreach service.

30 officers and members from the Brigade had successfully completed the Oral Health Ambassador Programme organized by the Dental Command in 2025.

Trainings

For the Public / Organizations

1. Jockey Club Heart-safe Community Project (賽馬會「顫動人心」社區計劃)

The "Jockey Club Heart-Saving Community Program," funded by the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust with an aim to enhance the first aid knowledge of public and improve the ability of community to save lives. The program commenced in December 2019 and concluded in November 2024. It taught the public on how to use Automated External Defibrillators (AED) and perform Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) through a series of training courses and educational talks. Over the past five years, the program provided courses to nearly 1,500 community service units which are funded by the Social Welfare Department with over 200,000 participants trained.



To strengthen the promotion to the community, the Association conducted a "Jockey Club Heart-Saving Community Program First Aid Fun Day" on Sunday, 1 September 2024 at Yue Man Square (裕民坊), and the "Jockey Club Heart-Saving Community Program Closing Ceremony" on Sunday, 13 October 2024 at the Atrium of D-Park Tsuen Wan. There were game booths, live demonstration of CPR, choking relief and pet first aid. Over 2,000 participants attended both events.

2. Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics (ALSO)

ALSO Provider courses were jointly organized by the Hong Kong College of Emergency Medicine and the Hong Kong College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists for the 15th consecutive year. To facilitate course participants to attend the course effectively, a blended learning mode was introduced. The blended mode allowed course participants to study the theory online and practice knowledge and skills at the face-to-face sessions. Four ALSO courses were conducted from 23 to 26 April 2024 at St. John Tower with 144 doctors, nurses and healthcare specialists participated.

3. Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers Course (醫護人員基本生命支援術課程)

The Association launched the first **Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers Course** on 21 September 2024. The primary target is frontline healthcare personnel. Through 4 hours of classroom instruction and intensive practical exercises, participants learn how to make the most effective decision and response in emergency situation to the patients. Participants who pass the examination will receive a certificate valid for 2 years. This course has been accredited for 4 Continuing Nursing Education (CNE) credits and 4 Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits.



4. All Hazards Disaster Response (AHDR) Provider Course

Developed by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT), supported by the American College of Emergency Physicians, the All Hazards Disaster Response (AHDR) course teaches students how to respond to different types of disaster scenarios they may encounter, including natural disasters, infrastructure failings, fires, radiological events, pandemics, active shooter incidents, and other mass casualty events. AHDR educates participants on how to analyse potential threats in their area, assess available resources and create a response plan that will save lives. It is an 8-hour classroom course for Emergency Medical Service practitioners at all levels. Three AHDR courses were conducted in 2024-25 with 76 participants attended.

5. Pre-hospital Trauma Life Support (PHTLS) Courses

The Association has become the sole provider of PHTLS courses in Hong Kong since 2002. The course was developed by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT) of the United States and was introduced into Hong Kong by the China-Hong Kong Chapter of the American College of Surgeons. This two-day intensive course gives instructions on kinematics of injuries, assessment and management of trauma patients with multiple injuries. Prospective trainees include doctors, nurses and pre-hospital care providers. Nine courses were conducted in 2024-25 with 224 candidates attended.



6. 1-hour Free First Aid Talk

The Association has launched a 1-hour Free First Aid Talk to Primary and Secondary schools since 2004 and the targeted beneficiaries are Primary 5 to 6 pupils and Form 1 to 2 Secondary students. The talk has been receiving positive responses. In 2024-25, approximately 210 schools with 37,868 students benefited from this program.

7. Free Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED) Training Courses for Members of the Public

The Sir Robert Ho Tung Charitable Fund has granted the Association funding for conducting free 6-hour CPR & AED training for members of the public since 2010. In 2024, the number of participants was 5,875 with 108 courses conducted. All qualified participants were awarded the Adult CPR and AED Provider Certificate with 3 years validity. Positive comments were received.



8. Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) & Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Education Project of Rotary 2024-2025

The Association collaborated with Rotary International District 3450 and the Hong Kong Northeast Rotary Club in launching the Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Education Program for 2024-2025. This program offers free courses, with St. John providing a 6-hour CPRAED certification course valid for 3 years. The aim of the program is to encourage public members of Hong Kong to learn adult CPR and the use of AED, empowering more people to have the ability to save lives.

The Opening Ceremony of the Program was officiated by Dr. the Honourable Ko Wing-man, GBS, JP, Member of The Executive Council of The HKSAR, on Saturday, 30 November 2024 at St. John Tower. The latest CPR/AED machines and technique were demonstrated.

9. Rotary Club Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Education Program (Macau)

The Macau Rotary Club invited the Association to conduct a Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) course in Macau. Dr. Chung Chin-hung, Council Chairman, Dr. Donald Li Kwok-tung, Association Director and some senior managers were invited to attend the Opening Ceremony on Sunday, 12 January 2025. 13 St. John AED Instructors taught 96 students on practical first aid skills. The feedbacks were overwhelming.



10. Advanced Medical Life Support (AMLS) Course

The Association has launched the Advanced Medical Life Support course developed by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT) of the United States since 2016. Apart from the didactic aspects, interactive simulations and problem solving scenarios have given participants realistic exposure to similar cases. In 2024, four AMLS courses were conducted with 103 participants attended.

The updating of the 4th edition of the AMLS course is currently in progress and will be implemented in the second quarter of 2025. Instructors from the 3rd edition have completed the necessary updates and are now officially recognized as AMLS 4th edition instructors. This transition ensures that they are equipped with the latest information and techniques in advanced medical life support.

11. Basic Life Support in Obstetrics (BLSO™) Provider Course

The American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) has granted the Association a license in conducting Basic Life Support in Obstetrics (BLSO™) Provider Course since 2017. The course objective is to provide training to pre-hospital care providers who wish to increase their knowledge and skills in the field of obstetrics. In 2024-25, six courses were conducted with 117 candidates attended.



Trainings

12. Basic Psychological Life Support (BPLS) Course

The 2-day BPLS Course was jointly developed by the Association and the Institute of Mental Health, Castle Peak Hospital in 2011. Participants joined the course to learn about emotion, anxiety, stress, positive psychology, common mental illnesses, together with the skills for managing panic patients. Seven BPLS courses were conducted in this fiscal year with 231 candidates attended.

13. Pet First Aid and Emergency Care Course (PETFA)

The Pet First Aid and Emergency Care Course was launched in 2015 in collaboration with the Hong Kong Veterinary Association (HKVA), and has grown in popularity since the first class. In 2024-25, thirty-three classes were carried out with over 1,237 participants attended.



14. First Aid Specialty Course on Sports Emergencies

With the successful promotion of First Aid Specialty Course on Sports Emergencies, the “Sports Medicine Committee” (運動醫學小組) was formally established in September 2008. The Committee aims to design a strategic plan for the development of sports related courses or workshops, and to serve as the responsible body for continuous quality assurance of sports courses held.

Seven Sports Emergencies courses were conducted from April 2024 to March 2025 with 222 participants attended.

15. Travel Industry Authority (TIA) has commissioned the Association to conduct the Certificate of Competency in First Aid for Tourist Guide & Tour Escort 『急救技能證書課程』 and has extended the period from 1 September 2022 to 31 August 2025 which will now end on 31 August 2028. In addition, TIA has also approved the Association as one of the course providers for the Certificate of Competency in First Aid for Tourist Guides and Tour Escorts Refresher Course (急救技能證書重溫課程) from 1 January 2025 to 31 December 2026.

Trainings

For St. John Lecturers / Instructors / Officers and Members

1. Lecturer Training Course 2023/24 (LTC)

From September 2023 to December 2024, the candidates completed their courses and the third part of the teaching evaluation of LTC. As at December 2024, a total of 23 trainee lecturers had successfully passed their assessments and graduated, while an additional four trainee instructors had entered the evaluation stage.

To assist the new lecturers to familiarize themselves with the operation of the first aid courses, a mentor has been assigned to each new lecturer to assist them in adapting the teaching and examination procedures. On 18 December 2024, the Association conducted a pre-teaching orientation for the new lecturers. The session covered the Association's structure, course content and key teaching considerations, to ensure a smooth teaching experience for all new lecturers.



2. Home Nursing 2020 – Lecturer Workshop

The Home Nursing 2020 - Lecturer Workshop was held on 21 January 2025 at St. John Tower. 29 Home Nursing Lecturers learned the effective teaching techniques through sharing by senior Lecturers, previously recorded teaching videos, and ongoing assessment practices. Since 2021, the Association has been conducting the Home Care 2020 course, which teaches the principles of home care, introduces various home care and handling methods, and demonstrates how to apply home care skills through practical classroom sessions.

In addition, the Association was approved by the Hong Kong Nursing Council on 13 November 2024 to organize Continuing Nursing Education (CNE) seminars or activities from 13 November 2024 to 12 November 2027.



Trainings

3. Basic Psychological Life Support Instructor Course (基本心理支援術導師課程)

To further promote mental health education in the community and train qualified instructors to teach the public about understanding emotions, stress, anxiety, and coping strategies, the Association and the Institute of Mental Health, Castle Peak Hospital jointly organized a 16-hour “Basic Psychological Life Support Instructor Course” (BPLS Instructor Course).

In 2024, a two-day course was successfully held on 2 and 6 November 2024 at St. John Tower with 18 people participated. The contents included an advanced course for Basic Psychological Life Support instructors (4 hours) and teaching methodology and trial teaching (8 hours).

The candidates are required to pass a teaching assessment (16 hours) to complete the course successfully. After passing the assessment, they will officially become St. John Instructors (BPLS), adding more professional talent to the course.



4. New Member Foundation Training Course

To enhance the understanding of new Brigade members regarding Hong Kong St. John Ambulance and prepare for the first aid duty, the Brigade launched the “New Member Foundation Training Course (NMFTC)” in June 2024. This foundation training covers essential topics, including knowledge about St. John, team building, foot drill training, basic ambulance equipment training, occupational safety and health, practical on-duty exercises and home nursing. Additionally, all new members are required to complete the Foundation Training Course within one year from joining to ensure they acquire essential knowledge and can apply it effectively during their first aid duties, embodying the motto of St. John, "For the Service of Mankind." As of 31 March 2025, a total of 89 new Brigade members have successfully completed the Foundation Training Course since its inception in June 2024.

5. Training and activities for Cadets and Adult members of the Brigade personnel & Youth Command were organized separately by the Brigade and Youth with the support from Headquarters staff. A summary of the trainings is as below:

Special Programs

1. Retirement for Brigade Commissioner

Dr. Alfred So Ping-fai retired from the post as Brigade Commissioner on 7 February 2025. A Thanksgiving Dinner for the Appreciation to Brigade Commissioner, organized by the Members of the Commissioner's Conference was held on Wednesday, 15 January 2025, bidding farewell to Dr. Alfred So who had served St. John for over 43 years.



2. Youth Command Challenge Day 2024 was held on Saturday, 11 May 2024 at Law Ting Pong Secondary School. Challenging game booths, Dodgebee competitions and Intellectual Challenges were set up. Nearly 200 Officers and Cadet Members attended the event.



Special Programs

3. The “10,000 Miles Friendship Trek 2024” was held from 20 to 28 July 2024. The theme of this year was “Exploring Chinese Culture”. A total of 25 Officers and Cadets participated in this meaningful trip. In these 9 days, participants visited the museums, Mausoleum of the First Qin Emperor, enterprises and schools in two cities namely Beijing and Xian.



4. Guizhou Exchange Program 2024

With the aim to promote communication and cultural exchange with the youth and young people in Mainland China, Youth Command organized a Guizhou Exchange Program from 2 to 7 August 2024. A total of 4 Officers and 36 Cadet Members from the Youth Command joined the 6-day Exchange Program including visit to families at the village, volunteer work at school, experience at traditional dying workshop and visits to museums. The objectives to enhance mutual understanding on academic studies, career and personal developments as well as the future development of Hong Kong were achieved.



Special Programs

5. Cambodia Youth Exchange Tour

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance has always been eager in organizing extensive services for young people. With the funding from the Youth Development Commission's "Funding Scheme for International Youth Exchange" and Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Brigade Youth Command Presidents' Club, **The 2024 Cambodia Youth Exchange Tour** was held from 12 to 17 August 2024. 20 Officers and Cadet Members experienced a 6-day Exchange Program by visiting NGOs, schools and landmarks to let the team members know more about the local culture and urban development of Cambodia.



6. 3-on-3 Basketball Competition

To celebrate the 75th Anniversary of the Founding of the People's Republic of China, **3-on-3 Basketball Competition** of Youth Command was held on Saturday, 23 November 2025 at Kai Yip Recreation Centre. More than 100 Officers and Cadet Members attended the event. Easy roll banners had been set up to promote patriotism among young people in Hong Kong and heighten their sense of national identity.

7. **The Commissioner's Shield Competition 2024** was held on Sunday, 27 October 2024 at 7/F, Aw Boon Haw Hall, St. John Tower. More than 90 Officers and Members from Commands formed the competition teams to participate in both written and practical tests of the Shield. Hong Kong Island Command won the Overall Championship.



8. **Service Medal Presentation Ceremony 2024**
The Service Medal, Service Bar, Commissioner's Commendation cum Retired Personnel Souvenir Presentation Ceremony 2024 was held on Sunday, 20 October 2024 at 7/F, Aw Boon Haw Hall, St. John Tower. There were 386 recipients awarded the Service Medal, Service Bar, Commissioner's Commendation and Retired Personnel Souvenirs. Over 300 participants including Brigade personnel, awardees, their family members and friends attended the ceremony.



Special Programs

9. 2024-25 Thematic Subvention for Uniformed Groups (2024-25 年度主題撥款計劃)

Sponsored by the Home and Youth Affairs Bureau and the Family Council, four activities were organized under the 2024-25 Thematic Subvention for Uniformed Groups to strengthen mutual communications and trust among different family members and help to build a harmonious family relationship. Over 2,500 youth members, their family members and the general public participated in the program, including visiting Sha Tau Kok, Island side day tour, Parent-child handicraft workshop, Touch Rugby Experience Day and Family Fun Day respectively.

10. Brigade Centenary Scholarship 2024

Established in 2017, the Brigade Centenary Scholarship is an award scheme for outstanding Cadets who pursue medical/ health care related undergraduate programs offered by the eight University Grants Committee (UGC)-funded local universities. Leadership qualities and commitments to St. John are also the essential criteria for the selection. Since its establishment, 37 Cadets have been benefited from this scholarship. In 2024, 8 Cadets were selected and awarded the scholarship who were studying either the Bachelor of Medicine, Surgery or Nursing programs.



11. Passing Out Parade 2024 cum National Security Education Day

The Passing Out Parade of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Brigade Youth Command together with National Security Education Day was held on Sunday, 9 March 2025 at Perth Street Playground. More than 300 new Cadets, teachers, parents and Officers of Youth Command attended the event. Mr. Dave Yau Shu-fung, Deputy Commissioner of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Brigade was invited as the Guest of Honor. Game booths related to National Security had been set up and manned by the Cadets. Flag Raising Ceremony and marching band performance were also held.

12. Shenzhen Study Tour

With the aim to enhance the national identity, Youth Command organized a one-day Shenzhen Study Tour on Saturday, 22 March 2025. A total of 42 Officers and Cadet Members from the Youth Command joined the tour to experience the development of AI and robotic technology. They also visited museums, environmental related education centre and ancient sceneries.

Health checking counters for measuring blood pressure, BMI and hearing, first aid demonstration and game booths were set up to provide services for around 2,000 citizens during the day.

14. Quality Assurance on Brigade Medical and First Aid Service

To ensure all Brigade Commands keep the quality of services offer to the local community, the Brigade Medical Committee and its Medic Bag Sub-committee were set up to oversee all medical related issues of Brigade service included infection control measures, use of personal protective equipment, audit of medical kit, first aid service record form, use AED audit, first aid bag standardisation etc.



15. The “Jockey Club Badges: Preparing Tomorrow’s Leaders”

The project “Along with St. John” (聖約翰·您的急救之侶) was funded by Hong Kong Jockey Club under the project: Preparing Tomorrow’s Leaders. Training programs including Pet First Aid Course, CPRAED Course, Introduction to First Aid & CPR Certificate Course, Ambulance Equipment Training Course, St. John Cadet Experience Day and Board Game Workshop had been held. Social Service Programs & workshops were also organized under this project. During this 2-year project, the estimate beneficiaries will be over 10,000 personnel including St. John members and the general public.

16. Publicity in various Local Media & Event

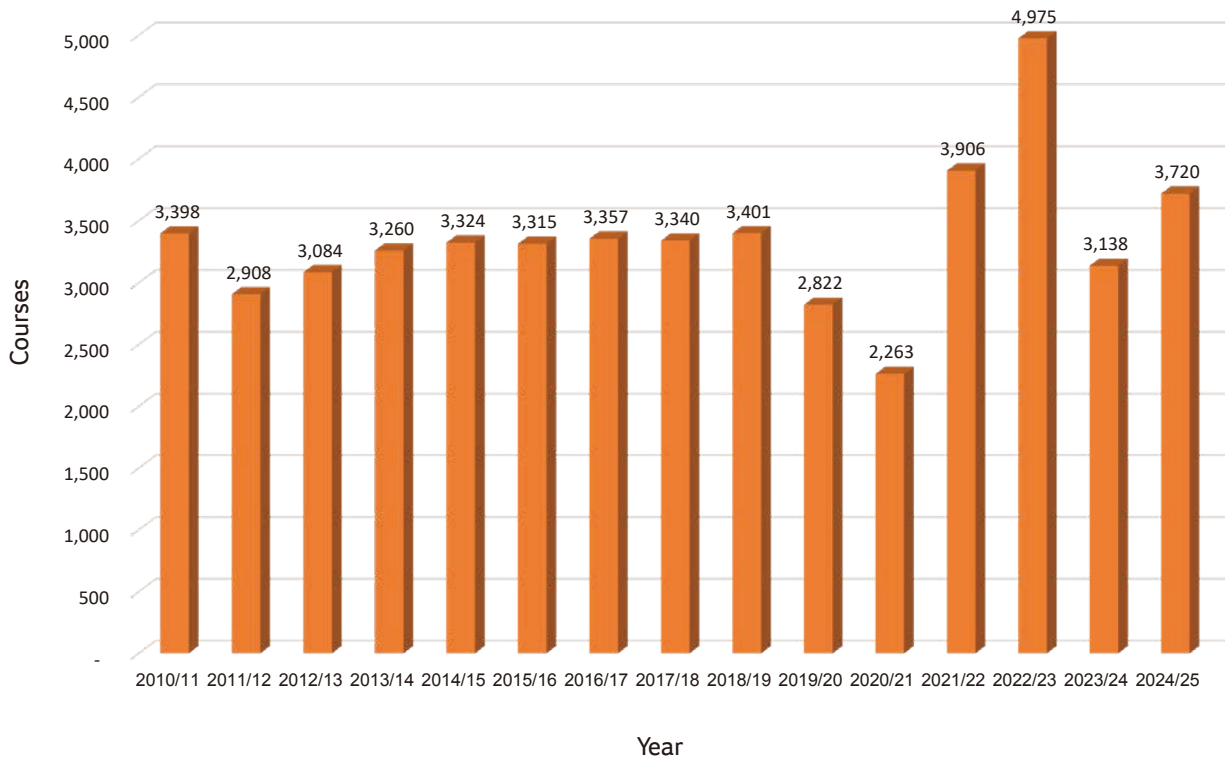

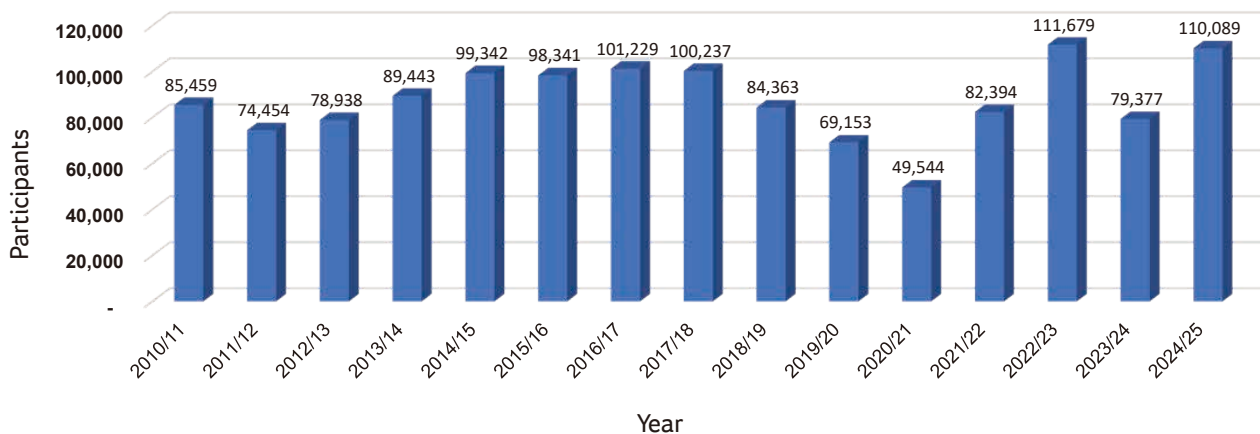

(2010 - 2025)**

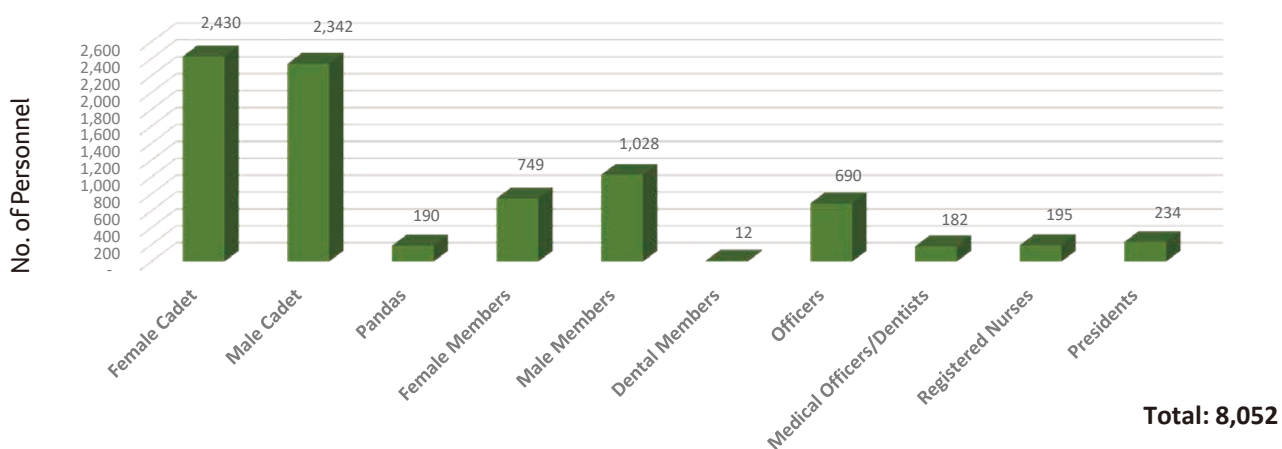


**Total number of participants enrolled in Training Courses conducted during
2010 - 2025**

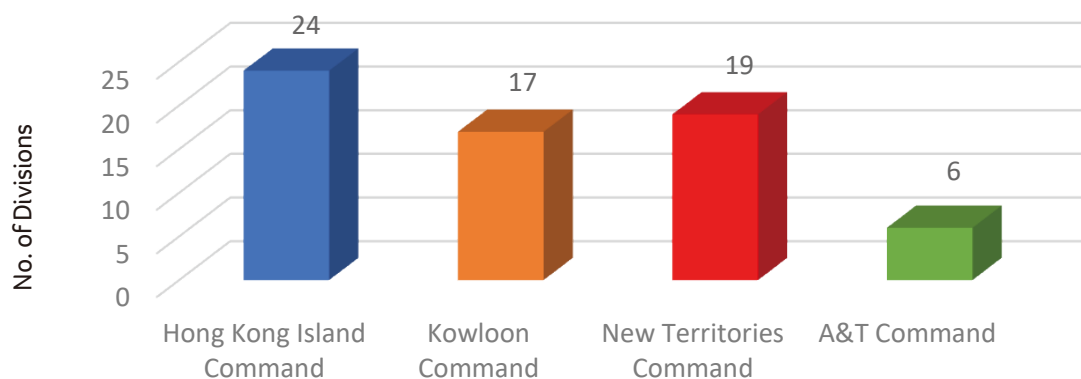

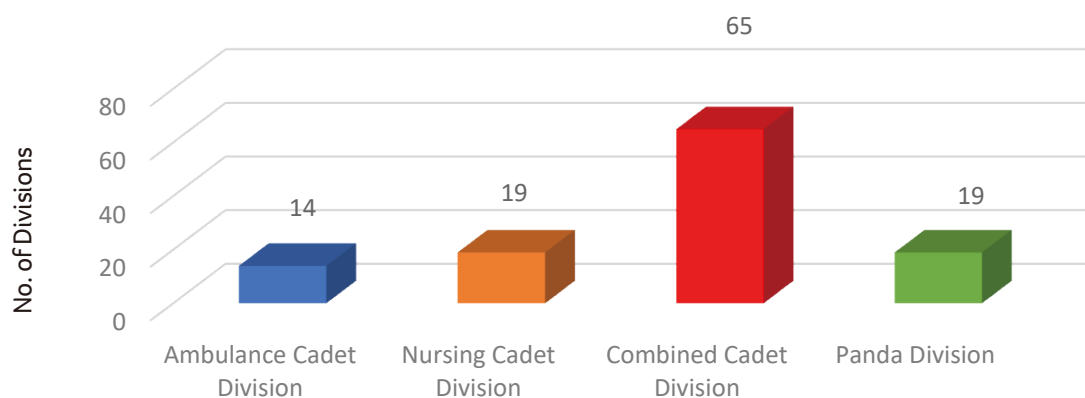
Strength of the Brigade as at 31 March 2025



Number of Divisions in the Hong Kong Island / Kowloon / New Territories / Ambulance & Transport Command

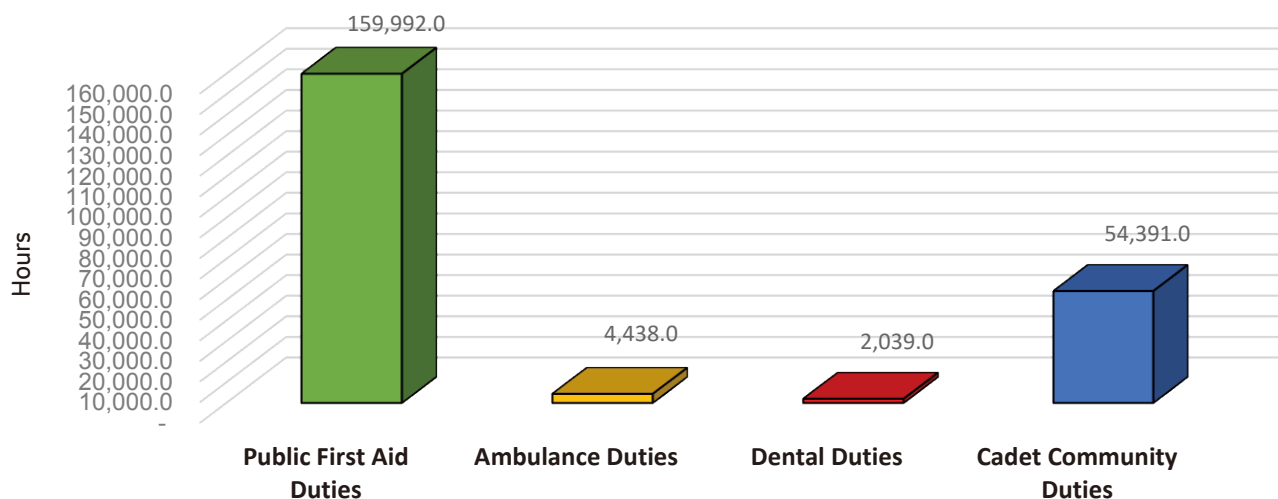


Number of Divisions in the Youth Command



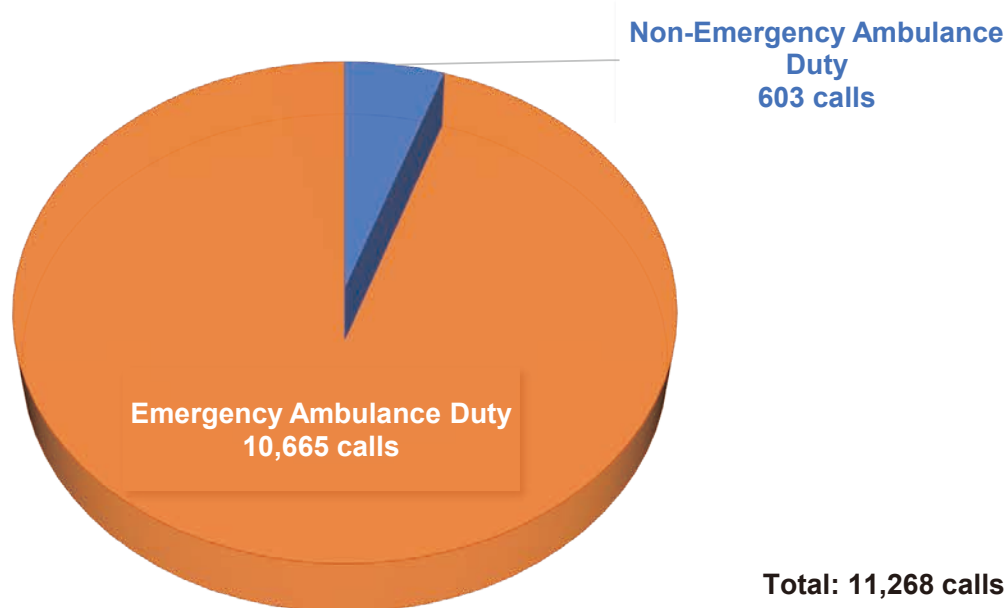
