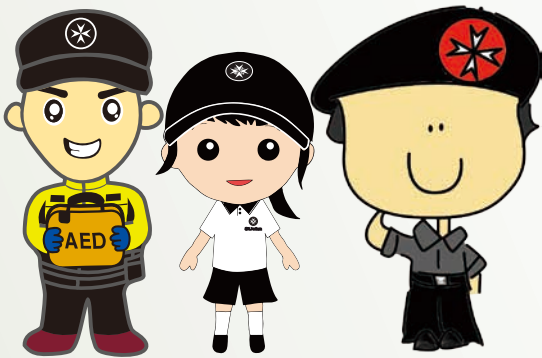

# Introduction

**Hong Kong St. John Ambulance** has been established in Hong Kong for 142 years. It was first started in 1884 in the name of “Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Association” and inaugurated in 1900. The **Brigade** was formally established in 1916 during World War I, followed by the establishment of the **Council** in 1949 after World War II. In 2015, Hong Kong was upgraded as a **Priory** of the Order of St. John. As an ex-officio member of the Grand Council of the Order, Hong Kong ever since then has a broader scope of involvement in international policies and activities.

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance has been well-known in the provision of First Aid training and Ambulance services to the general public in Hong Kong. The principle and spirit of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance as embodied in the motto “**For the Service of Mankind**” remain unchanged after the enactment of the new **Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Incorporation Ordinance (Chapter 1164)** on 27 June 1997. Hong Kong St. John Ambulance continues in promoting and encouraging all works of humanity and charity for the relief of distress, suffering, sickness, danger and poverty without any distinction as to colour, class or creed.

The **Council** is the supreme governing body of **Hong Kong St. John Ambulance** and is charged with the governance, management and control of all businesses and activities of the Corporation. The Council is composed of dedicated volunteers from various professions and the Assistant Director (Administration and Policy) of the Department of Health also sits in the Council as an observer. The Council’s work is facilitated by its standing Committees, namely, Two MacDonnell Road Panel, Finance, Honours and Awards, Public Relations, Property Management and Development, Greater China Affairs, Ambulance Service Steering and Information Technology.

The **Association**, the training branch, has been the premier organization of the territory responsible for instructing members of the general public the principles and practice of First Aid, Home Nursing and allied subjects since 1884. The **Director’s Conference** ensures that training works of the Association are conducted effectively and efficiently. There are 618 volunteer lecturers and instructors, including doctors, nurses, allied health professionals and non-professionals.

The **Brigade**, the service branch, is responsible for organizing training and equipping adult and youth members to undertake, on a voluntary basis, First Aid, Home Nursing, Ambulance and Community Services to those in need. The services are free. The **Commissioner’s Conference** is responsible for overseeing the organization, administration, services provision and development of the Brigade. At present, there are 7,754 members, made up of 2,954 Adult and 4,800 Youth members including 227 members from St. John Pandas.

# Chairman's Report

My first involvement with Hong Kong St. John Ambulance was in the late 80s when I was invited to represent St. John in a First Aid Television Program - "First Aid Vanguard", organized by Radio Television Hong Kong. I was formally admitted as a member of the St. John Ambulance Brigade in 1991. For 35 years, I have gone through the ladder from a Divisional Surgeon to Council Chairman and Prior. I am deeply grateful to St. John for widening my social circle, giving me invaluable life experiences, enhancing my self-development and providing opportunities for me to serve the community. To repay the debts of gratitude, I have tried my best for the good of St. John, as a loyal supporter and defender, which I shall remain always.

Last year marked the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of The St. John Priory of Hong Kong. A celebration dinner was initially planned in December 2025, but was cancelled in the devastating sentiment immediately after the tragedy of the Wang Fuk Court Fire in late November! Instead, a mini-stand of the Priory Flag was produced as a souvenir to members of The Order of St. John.

With the official opening of the Kai Tak Sports Park on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2025, the 15<sup>th</sup> National Games of the People's Republic of China, 12<sup>th</sup> National Games for Persons with Disabilities and 9<sup>th</sup> National Special Olympic Games held in Hong Kong in November and December 2025, activities and services of the Brigade were gaining momentum towards the pre-Covid level. The Brigade provided 246,902.75 man-hours of first aid, dental and community services in 2025-26 (compared with 220,860 in 2024-25 and the Funding & Service Agreement with the Department of Health of 170,000 man-hours annually). The ambulance service delivered 11,034 emergency transport and 766 non-emergency duties in 2025-2026 (compared with 10,665 emergencies and 603 non-emergencies in 2024-25 and the Funding & Service Agreement with the Department of Health of 7,000 emergencies and 750 non-emergencies). Notably, volunteers helped to provide additional service on weekday evenings from 19:00 – 23:00 hour. The number of students trained by the Association in 2025-26 was 88,760 (compared with 110,089 in 2024-25 and our Funding & Service Agreement with the Department of Health of 21,000). Praiseworthy, this is the first time in 10 years that we could fully meet (and exceed) the requirements in the Funding & Service Agreement with the Department of Health finally.

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance is the only organization in Hong Kong using "Ambulance" in its name. With the milestone publication of the Ambulance Aid Manual in December 2024 and the successful training of 74 Ambulance Aid Lecturers in July 2025, two Ambulance Aid provider courses have been run in the first half of this year. From now on, standardized and systematic Ambulance Aid training will be offered to all St. John Ambulance staff and volunteers, and perhaps outsiders. Hopefully, all St. John members will be trained in Ambulance Aid, in addition to First Aid and Defibrillation, upholding our image and brand name in the quality of service to the community.

# Chairman's Report

Finally, our Kowloon Command & New Territories Command Headquarters Redevelopment Project has been gaining slow progress, obtaining understanding from both the Hospital Authority and the Department of Health and the written support from the Health Bureau. We are waiting for the support letter from the Home and Youth Affairs Bureau, before our final application to the Town Planning Board.

The achievement and success that have been made by Hong Kong St. John Ambulance would not be possible without the dedication and commitment of our volunteers and staff. In addition, the generosity and guidance of the Department of Health, Home and Youth Affairs Bureau, Hong Kong Jockey Club, Community Chest, Sir Robert Ho Tung Charitable Fund, Rotary Clubs of Hong Kong and other donors keep us on the right track to respond to the needs of our local community, enabling the continuation and expansion of our services and works.

I wish St. John every success in future. Glory goes to every member of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance.

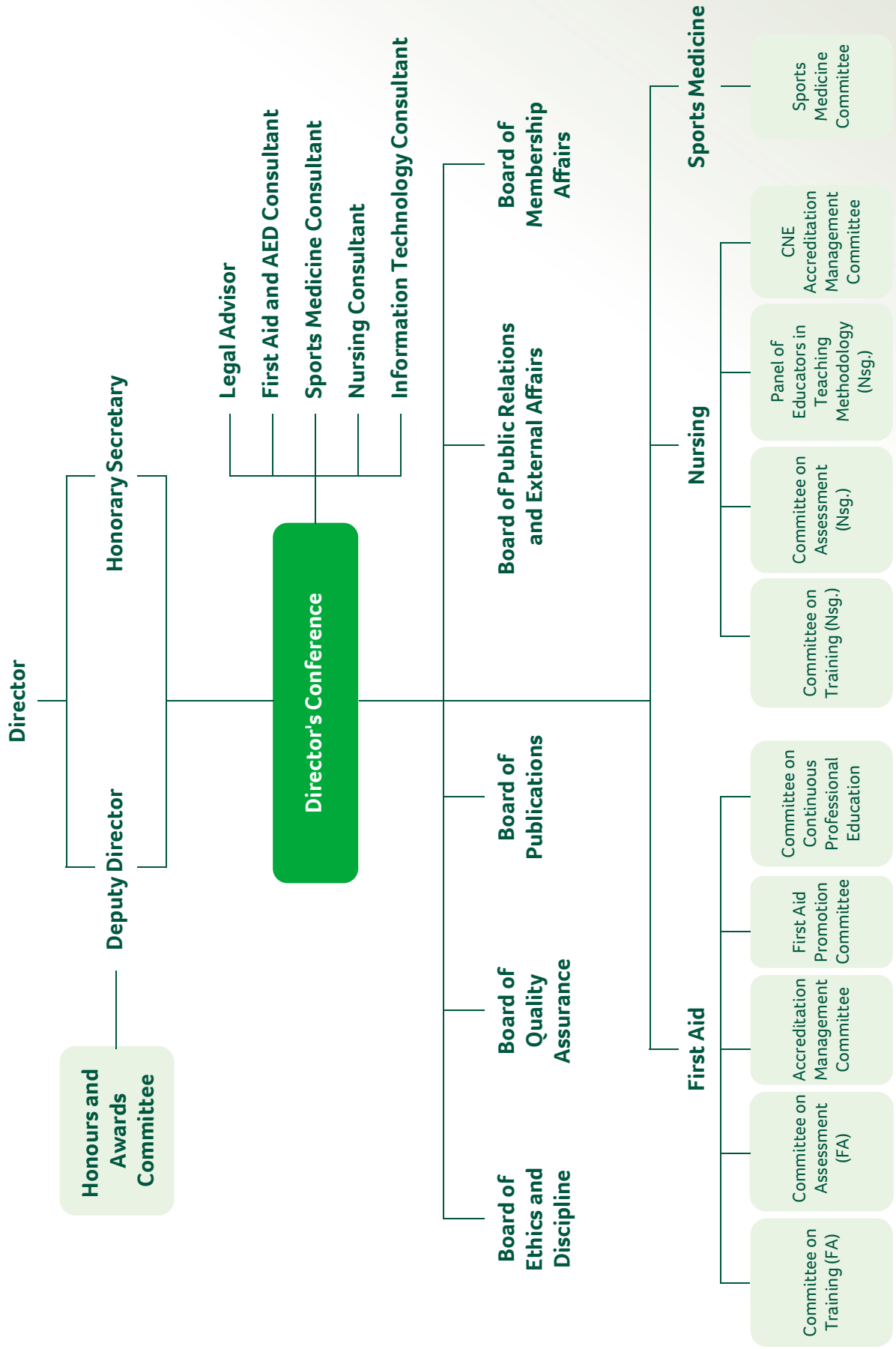

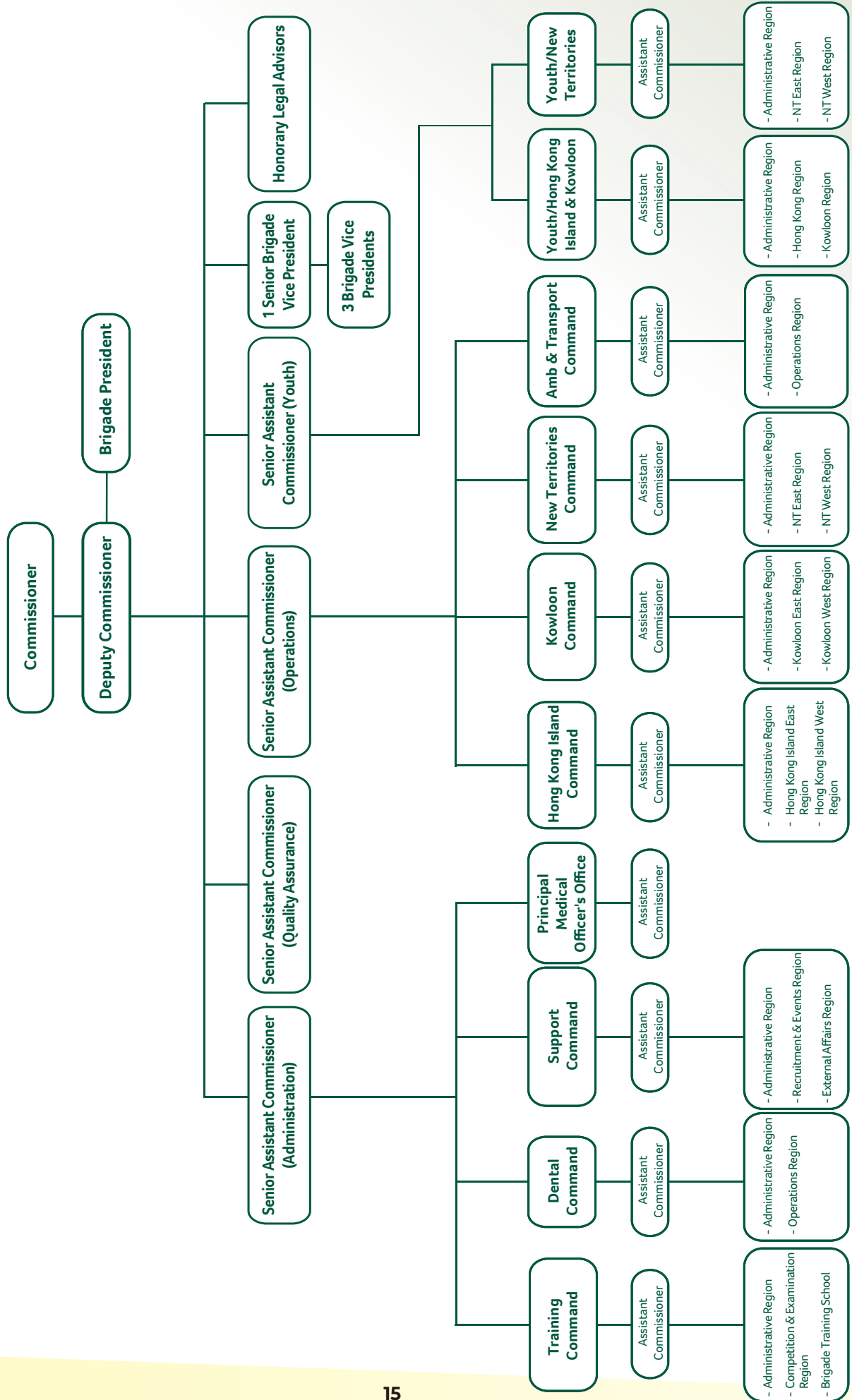

## 2. The 15<sup>th</sup> National Games, the 12<sup>th</sup> National Games for Persons with Disabilities and the 9<sup>th</sup> Special Olympic Games

The year 2025 marked a historic milestone for Hong Kong as it co-hosted the 15<sup>th</sup> National Games, the 12<sup>th</sup> National Games for Persons with Disabilities, and the 9<sup>th</sup> Special Olympic Games. As the city's debut in hosting a national-level sporting event, the Brigade rose to the challenge with unprecedented scale and professionalism.

The Games concluded successfully on 15 December 2025, following a massive mobilization of our resources. Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Brigade was entrusted with providing on-site first-aid and ambulance standby services at selected competition venues, as well as 24-hour medical emergency support at hotels accommodating athletes and technical officials

Over 1,000 members, including 100 medical professionals, registered for this event, marking the largest single event deployment in the Brigade's history.

Success was built on six months of rigorous preparation, including participation in test events for golf, handball and triathlon. ## 3. Fire Disaster at Wang Fuk Court, Tai Po on 26 November 2025

In response to the request by Fire Services Communication Centre (FSCC) for the special call out duty, the Brigade deployed six ambulances to the scene from 26 November 2025 evening to support the fire disaster at Wang Fuk Court, Tai Po. On top of this, extra ambulances were also arranged to provide support to other emergency calls/ hospital transfer duties.

The special duty stand down on 28 November 2025, i.e., two days after the incident. A total of 12 ambulances involving 46 staff/volunteers were deployed to the scene. Five patients were transferred to the hospital by ambulances of St John.

While the whole city mourned for the loss in the tragic fire, the Association responded promptly by organizing a special online seminar titled “**Disaster Emotional Support**” on Saturday, 29 November 2025. The event aimed to provide immediate psychological support to those affected by the incident, as well as to members of the public worrying about community well-being. The seminar was conducted by Dr. Chan Sui-bing, a distinguished psychotherapist from The University of Edinburgh. Transitioning to an online platform allowed for broad and rapid community access. Key topics included **Psychological impact of disaster events on mental health, practical techniques for managing emotions and stress and effective methods for supporting others through emotional distress**. The importance of mental health awareness was clearly reflected in the high level of engagement. The seminar received an overwhelming response, reaching a peak attendance of 191 participants.

A designated hotline, manned by psychiatrists, psychiatry nurses and counsellors from St. John Brigade was also set up to provide emotional support to Brigade personnel having affected by the event.

4. The **Annual Service of Dedication** was held on Sunday, 22 June 2025 at St. John's Cathedral. Miss Rosanna Law Shuk-pui, JP, Secretary for Culture, Sports and Tourism attended the Service and read the Second Lesson.



5. **Breaking the World Record in performing Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED) simultaneously**

On Monday, 30 June 2025, the Association participated in a large-scale training event organized by the Tseung Kwan O Resuscitation Alliance. The activity involved more than 20 St. John instructors and 200 participants, including youths, teachers, and parents from the Sai Kung District. The curriculum focused on CPR and AED operation, aiming to strengthen emergency response capabilities within the community.

Following the training, St. John instructors led participants in a synchronized CPR drill. This collective effort successfully challenged the world record for the **“Most People Performing CPR Simultaneously”**, officially certified by the World Record Association (Hong Kong).

6. The **Secretary for Home and Youth Affairs' (SHYA) Commendation Scheme** aims to commend individuals for their long-term dedication towards the training and development of youths in Uniformed Groups (UGs), distinguished community services, or support to the promotion of culture and sports. There were two types of awards, namely the “UG Volunteer Leader (UGVL)” and “UG Youth Volunteer Leader (UGYVL)” presented to selected nominees with distinguished performance from the local Uniformed Groups (UGs) under the administration of the Home and Youth Affairs Bureau.

In 2024, Chief Superintendent Thomas Kwan Kam-yiu of the Youth Command was awarded the UGVL, whereas Assistant Superintendent Chiu Sze-wai and Ambulance Officer Wang Lok-to were awarded the UGYVL in recognition of their outstanding and continuous contribution in youth services through the Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Brigade Youth Command. The Presentation Ceremony was held on Saturday, 30 August 2025.



7. 2025-26 was a vibrant year for **International Exchanges and Fellowship**, reinforcing the connections within the global St. John family.

✧ **Visit of Delegation from the National Health Commission**

On Thursday, 30 July 2025, a visiting delegation from the inaugural “*Interdisciplinary and Composite Talents in Medicine, Disease Prevention and Control, and Management Training Programme*” organized by the School of Public Health, LKS Faculty of Medicine of The University of Hong Kong visited the Headquarters of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance. The delegation was welcomed by Dr. Donald Li Kwok-tung, GBS, CStJ, JP, Director of the St. John Ambulance Association and Mr. Dave Yau Shu-fung, KStJ, Commissioner of the St. John Ambulance Brigade. During the visit, members of the delegation were introduced to the equipment and training courses provided by Hong Kong St. John Ambulance and observed a Traffic Accident First Aid Simulation, which showcased the practical application of emergency response training.

- Site visits of the Dental Clinic, Cycle Response Unit (CRU) at Tai Mei Tuk and the St. John Ambulance Control Centre (SJACC).

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance was awarded **Certificate of Registration ISO 9001:2015** in February 2020 with the scope of “The Provision of Training Services of Certificate in First Aid, Automated External Defibrillation Provider and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation courses at St. John Tower”.

In February 2026, St. John successfully passed its ISO 9001:2015 quality management audit, extending its certification validity through February 2029. This achievement marks six consecutive years of compliance and stands as a testament to the organization’s unwavering dedication to delivering high-quality training services.

The Passing Out Parade of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Brigade Youth Command together with National Security Education Day was held on Sunday, 8 March 2026 at Perth Street Playground. Both the Certificate in Health Worker Training and the Foundation Certificate in Training for Care Workers have successfully passed the HKCAAVQ assessment and will retain their respective QF levels and credits until 30 June 2028.

# Service Reports

1. During the reporting year, the Brigade discharged a total of 246,902.75 man-hours of volunteer first aid, ambulance duties, dental and community services for the public.
2. In 2025/26, the Brigade responded to 11,800 emergency and non-emergency calls for ambulance services. A detailed breakdown of these calls is tabulated below for easy reference.

### 3. Dental Service

The dental service provided by Hong Kong St John Ambulance Brigade has been in operation for over 75 years.

Free dental service is made available to the elderly and patients with special needs by Brigade volunteer dentists, dental surgery assistants and members at the Dental Clinic located at the St. John Headquarters or elderly homes by the Outreach Team. In addition, oral health services are provided to the public through campaigns and special events.

In 2025/26, volunteers in the Dental Command provided dental services to a total of 414 patients with 853 cases being treated in the dental clinic and 574 members of the public received oral hygiene education and free consultation during the outreach service.



# Trainings

## For the Public / Organizations

### 1. Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics (ALSO)

ALSO Provider courses were jointly organized by the Hong Kong College of Emergency Medicine and the Hong Kong College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists for the 16<sup>th</sup> consecutive year. To facilitate course participants to attend the course effectively, a blended learning mode was introduced. The blended mode allowed course participants to study the theory online and practice knowledge and skills at the face-to-face sessions. Four ALSO courses were successfully conducted from 13 to 16 May 2025 at 7/F, St. John Tower with 136 doctors, nurses and healthcare specialists participated.

Participants actively engaged in practical sessions guided by experienced doctors, registered nurses, midwives, and university lecturers specializing in obstetrics. They shared knowledge and exchanged experiences throughout the training. All participants successfully passed the assessment, and it was expected that they would further enhance their knowledge of obstetrics through this course.



### 2. Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers Course (BLSHC)

The **BLSHC** for healthcare providers is a cornerstone of professional medical training, designed to equip healthcare personnel with the essential skills needed to recognize and respond to life-threatening emergencies. In the last fiscal year, 15 BLSHC courses were conducted, with a total of 246 participants.



# Trainings

## 3. All Hazards Disaster Response (AHDR) Provider Course

Developed by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT), supported by the American College of Emergency Physicians, the All Hazards Disaster Response (AHDR) course teaches students how to respond to different types of disaster scenarios they may encounter, including natural disasters, infrastructure failings, fires, radiological events, pandemics, active shooter incidents, and other mass casualty events. AHDR educates participants on how to analyse potential threats in their area, assess available resources and create a response plan that will save lives. It is an 8-hour classroom course for Emergency Medical Service practitioners at all levels. Two AHDR courses were conducted in 2025-26 with 43 participants attended.

## 4. Pre-hospital Trauma Life Support (PHTLS) Course

The Association has become the sole provider of PHTLS courses in Hong Kong since 2002. The course was developed by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT) of the United States and was introduced into Hong Kong by the Hong Kong Chapter of the American College of Surgeons. This two-day intensive course gives instructions on kinematics of injuries, assessment and management of trauma patients with multiple injuries. Prospective trainees include doctors, nurses and pre-hospital care providers. Nine courses were conducted in 2025-26 with 204 candidates attended.

The Association was invited by the Guangzhou Emergency Medical Command Center (廣州市急救醫療指揮中心) to conduct the 10<sup>th</sup> Edition PHTLS Course on 30 and 31 October 2025. The course was led by Dr. Chung Chin-hung, Council Chairman of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance, serving as Course Director, with Dr. Leung Chin-san as Course Coordinator. Supported by St. John instructors Mr. Lee Man-fai, Ms. Yau Hoi-sze, and Mr. Lee Bing-yin, the Hong Kong team collaborated with local Guangzhou instructors to deliver a comprehensive curriculum. The intensive two-day PHTLS course was tailored for 30 physicians and nurses, with **Standardized Trauma Assessment, Critical Interventions** and **Team Dynamics**.



# Trainings

## 5. 1-hour Free First Aid Talk

The Association has launched a 1-hour Free First Aid Talk to Primary and Secondary schools since 2004 and the targeted beneficiaries are Primary 5 to 6 pupils and Form 1 to 2 Secondary students. The talk has been receiving positive responses. In 2025-26, approximately 133 schools with 22,200 students benefited from this program.



## 6. Free Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED) Training Courses for Members of the Public

The Sir Robert Ho Tung Charitable Fund has granted the Association funding for conducting free 6-hour CPR & AED training for members of the public since 2010. In 2025, the number of participants was 2,830 with 47 courses conducted. All qualified participants were awarded the Adult CPR and AED Provider Certificate with 3 years validity. Positive comments were received.

## 7. Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) & Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Education Project of Rotary 2025-2026

The Association collaborated with Rotary International District 3450 and the Hong Kong Northeast Rotary Club in launching the Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED) Education Program for 2025-2026. The Opening Ceremony, held on Saturday 22 November 2025, marked the continuation of a life-saving mission founded in 2016 by Dr. Wong Tai-hung. The goal remains clear to empower the citizens of Hong Kong with the skills to save lives.

The program is scaling its impact. Ms. Edwige Radlo, Co-Chair of the Organizing Committee and President of the Rotary Club of Northeast Hong Kong (2025-2026), shared two exciting updates for this term: the program is expanding to reach primary and secondary school students, teachers and staff, and it is developing deep partnerships with various organizations to enhance emergency response capabilities across the city. The ceremony was graced by Guest of Honor, Dr. the Honourable Ko Wing-man, GBS, JP, Member of The Executive Council of the HKSAR. Program Ambassadors, popular artists Mr. Matthew Ho (何廣沛) and Miss Windy Zhan (詹天文), joined to spread the message of emergency preparedness to the younger generation.

One of the highlights of the event was a live demonstration, where candidates took to the stage to show how to perform Adult CPR and operate an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). Their confidence served as a reminder that with the right training, anyone—regardless of age—can become a lifesaver.

## 8. Rotary Club Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Education Program (Macao)

On Sunday, 18 January 2026, the Association was invited by the Rotary Club of Penha, Macao to conduct a Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED) course in Macao. Dr. Chung Chin-hung was invited to attend the Opening Ceremony. 15 St. John Instructors conducted the training sessions. The event received an overwhelming response, with more than 100 enrollments. Throughout the day, candidates demonstrated remarkable engagement, actively participating in Q&A sessions and showing great enthusiasm during the hands-on practical segments.

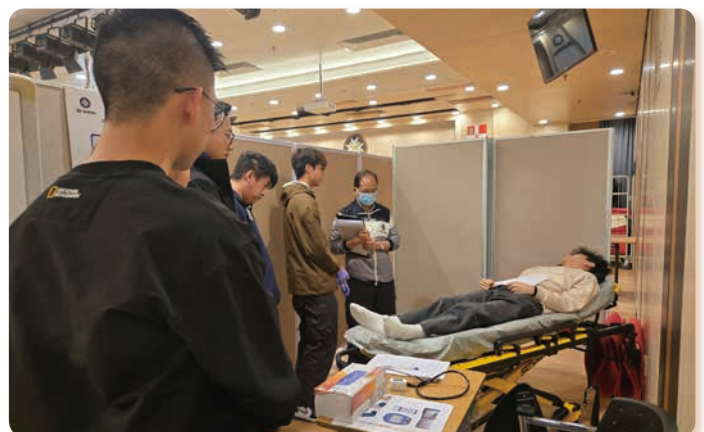


## 9. Advanced Medical Life Support (AMLS) Course

The Association has launched the Advanced Medical Life Support Course developed by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT) of the United States since 2016. This program is specifically designed for healthcare professionals, aiming to enhance skills in first aid and crisis management. The curriculum covers assessment, treatment, and transport strategies for acute conditions, with an emphasis on comprehensive patient care and rapid response. In the past fiscal year, five AMLS courses were conducted with a total of 98 participants.



The fourth edition of the course was successfully held at St. John Tower. This edition introduced new topics such as women's health and mental health, which are expected to provide doctors, nurses, and emergency personnel with up-to-date medical knowledge, strengthen practical competencies, and improve teamwork skills.



# Trainings

## 10. Basic Life Support in Obstetrics (BLSO™) Provider Course

The American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) has granted the Association a license in conducting Basic Life Support in Obstetrics (BLSO™) Provider Course since 2017. The program aims to equip participants with essential knowledge of obstetric emergencies and pre-hospital care through a balanced combination of theoretical learning and practical sessions. The third edition of the BLSO course manual was successfully delivered



on 19 July and 9 September 2025

at Aw Boon Haw Hall, 7/F, St. John Tower. This latest version introduced critical new modules, including Teamwork, Sepsis, and Mental Health. These updates ensured that participants received the most current medical information, significantly enhancing their practical capabilities and clinical skills.



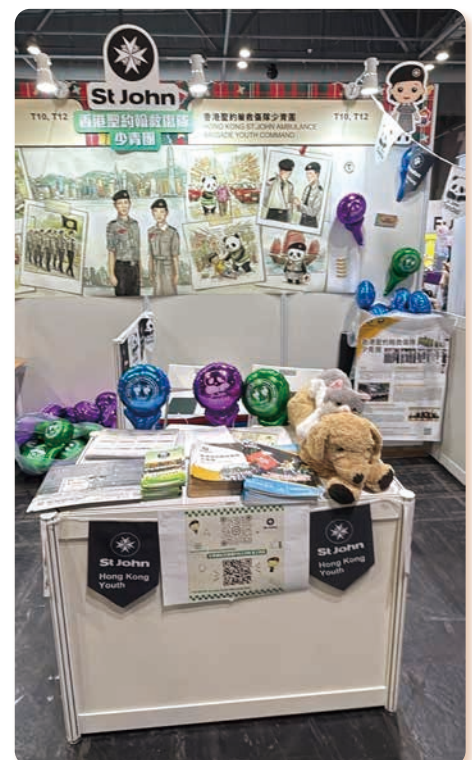
## 11. Basic Psychological Life Support (BPLS) Course

The 2-day BPLS Course has been jointly developed by the Association and the Institute of Mental Health, Castle Peak Hospital since 2011. Participants joined in the course to learn about emotion, anxiety, stress, positive psychology, common mental illnesses, together with the skills for managing panic patients. Eleven BPLS courses were conducted in this fiscal year with 311 candidates attended.

## 12. Pet First Aid and Emergency Care Course (PETFA)

The Pet First Aid and Emergency Care Course was launched in 2015 in collaboration with the Hong Kong Veterinary Association (HKVA). PETFA aims to enhance community knowledge of Pet First Aid and Emergency Care. Since its inception, the course has gained significant popularity, reflecting a growing interest in pet health and safety. In the last fiscal year, the Association conducted 34 PETFA courses, engaging a total of 1,251 participants.

The Association also participated in the 4<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong Schools Expo held on 14 December 2025 at AsiaWorld-Expo. The event featured live demonstrations of pet bandaging and pet CPR. The expo served as a vibrant platform for educational exchange, bringing together Primary and Secondary schools alongside esteemed organizations to provide academic and career guidance. The event successfully raised public awareness of the Pet First Aid Course, highlighting the importance of extending lifesaving skills to our furry companions.



# Trainings

## 13. First Aid Specialty Course on Sports Emergencies

With the successful promotion of the First Aid Specialty Course on Sports Emergencies, the “Sports Medicine Committee” (運動醫學小組) was formally established in September 2008. The Committee aims to design a strategic plan for the development of sports related courses or workshops; and to serve as the responsible body for continuous quality assurance of sports courses held. Six Sports Emergencies courses were conducted in 2025–26 with 195 participants attended.

## 14. ERB Foundation Certificate in Care-related Support Worker Training 「醫護支援人員（臨床病人服務）基礎證書課程」

The Foundation Certificate in Care-related Support Worker Training (Clinical Patient Services), commissioned by the Employees Retraining Board (ERB), is organized annually to support and encourage unemployed individuals or those seeking new career paths to enter the healthcare industry. This program enables participants to obtain qualifications recognized by the Hospital Authority, allowing them to apply for relevant professional positions.

The comprehensive curriculum covers an industry overview, practical skills training, personal development, and job-seeking techniques. Led by a team of experienced registered nurses and physiotherapists, the course provides students with well-rounded professional knowledge. Beyond individual career growth, the program aims to cultivate a high-quality workforce for the healthcare sector to serve citizens in need.

The course concluded on 5 September 2025, with a total of 23 students completing the intensive eight-week training program. We look forward to seeing our graduates contribute their skills and passion to the healthcare community.



# Trainings

## 15. Advancing Mental Health Education: Building a Compassionate and Resilient Society

The Association remains steadfast in its commitment to mental health education. By actively responding to community needs through diverse training programs and public outreach, we aim to strengthen psychological support and resilience among both the general public and frontline personnel.

In December 2025, the Association hosted a series of free mental health seminars, putting our commitment to community care into practice. On 6, 14, 21 and 28 December 2025, a series of public seminars was held across various districts. Attended by 70 participants, these sessions focused on emotional management, coping with stress and anxiety, fostering positive emotions, and promoting mental health.

On 13 December 2025, the Association partnered with *Be Priceless* to host a public mental health seminar. The event drew 31 participants and featured insights from our Basic Psychological Life Support Course instructors alongside Dr. Leong Chi-hang, further expanding the scope and reach of our mental health education efforts.

To enhance internal expertise, the Association invited Dr. Desmond Nguyen Gia-hung, a specialist in psychiatry, to lead a Continuous Professional Education seminar at St. John Tower on 17 December 2025. Titled 「如何在危機後建立心理抗逆力」, the session was attended by 44 Association members. This specialized training empowered our team to better provide psychological support and professional education in the aftermath of critical incidents.



# Trainings

## For St. John Lecturers / Instructors / Officers and Members

### 1. St. John Lecturer (Ambulance Aid) Training Course

On 16 December 2024, Hong Kong St. John Ambulance released Hong Kong's first ambulance-themed Ambulance Aid Manual. This comprehensive manual covers essential ambulance aid techniques, common equipment used in ambulances, the latest medical devices, and critical elements of ambulance services.

In preparation for the upcoming Ambulance Aid Provider Course, two “**St. John Lecturer (Ambulance Aid)**” Training Courses were held on 3 and 4 July 2025 at the 7/F Aw Boon Haw Hall of St. John Tower, and conducted by Dr. Chung Chin-hung, Council Chairman of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance. A total of 76 participants successfully passed the Ambulance Aid examination but 24 of them was required to attend a *Teaching Methodology Workshop for Ambulance Aid Lecturers* held on 27 July 2025. Unfortunately, two failed in the Teaching Methodology session, resulting in only 74 qualified Ambulance Aid Lecturers.



### 2. Ambulance Aid Provider Course

The first Ambulance Aid Provider Course was conducted over two consecutive weekends on 10, 11, 24, and 25 January 2026. Members from both the Association and the Brigade participated in this intensive four-day training. Throughout the sessions, attendees demonstrated exceptional enthusiasm and professionalism, with all 19 participants successfully graduating from the course. The program featured a distinguished teaching faculty led by Dr. Chung Chin-hung, Council Chairman of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance, together with more than eight Ambulance Aid Lecturers. Leveraging their extensive clinical and pedagogical expertise, the lecturers delivered comprehensive training in essential ambulance knowledge and practical skills.

## 3. First Aid Course Teaching Sharing Session 2025

To enhance the teaching quality of St. John Lecturers and Instructors, the Board of Quality Assurance (BQA) organized a sharing session in the evening of 28 April 2025, hosted by Dr. Chau Chi-wai, Chairman of the Board of Quality Assurance and Dr. Chan Tsan-ming, Chairman of the Accreditation Management and Teaching Development Committee.

The session featured an introduction to the BQA's workflow, a review of the past year's achievements and observations, an explanation of analysis results from course questionnaires, and the presentation of various improvement measures and teaching examples. These efforts reaffirm the commitment to course quality assurance. A total of 167 Lecturers and Instructors participated in the session.

## 4. Seminar on AI Applications in Teaching 「AI 教學用法講座」

On 8 October 2025, the Association hosted a seminar titled “*AI Applications in Teaching.*” During the two hour session, Mr. Emil Chan Ka-ho, Information Technology Consultant of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Association, delivered an insightful and accessible introduction to the use of Generative AI technology.

The seminar highlighted how Lecturers can leverage these tools to enhance candidate learning experiences and foster classroom interaction. The atmosphere was vibrant, with participants expressing strong enthusiasm for the future of AI-driven education.



# Trainings

## 5. Home Nursing 2020 Workshop for Lecturers

To welcome the newest cohort of Home Nursing Lecturers and foster a spirit of professional exchange, the Home Nursing 2020 Workshop for Lecturers was successfully held on 24 January 2026 at St. John Tower. The event saw an enthusiastic turnout of 54 participants, all dedicated to upholding the highest standards of community care.

The workshop was specifically designed to ensure new Lecturers have a comprehensive understanding of the St. John Ambulance Association and the core curriculum of the Home Nursing 2020 course. Since its inception in 2021, this course has been vital in *teaching the fundamental principles of home care; introducing diverse nursing knowledge and practical techniques for the home environment and providing hands-on practice to ensure skills are applied accurately and confidently.*

Beyond the curriculum, the workshop served as a valuable platform for veteran and new instructors to share experiences and learn from one another, thereby strengthening our teaching community.



## 6. Educational Videos for Home Nursing 2020 (Core Course)

To enhance course participants' proficiency in nursing procedures, the Association has produced a new series of educational videos for the Home Nursing 2020 (Core Course). A sharing session was held on 7 June 2025 at St. John Tower, bringing together St. John Home Nursing Lecturers to discuss the latest course developments and instructional techniques. The new video resources cover essential topics, including vital signs, general wound care and management of vomitus. The Nursing Team made significant contributions to the planning, live demonstrations, filming, and editing of these highquality teaching materials.

## 1. Hong Kong Island Disaster and Emergency Preparedness Day 2025

On 18 May 2025, the Association was invited by Fire Services Department to participate in the “Hong Kong Island Disaster and Emergency Preparedness Day” held at the Wan Chai Promenade. The Association’s booth showcased defibrillators, CPR training equipment, and materials from the Pet First Aid Course. St. John instructors stationed at the booth introduced the organization’s training programs and provided on-site demonstrations of CPR and defibrillation techniques to visitors. Members of the public showed strong interest in pet first aid, particularly pet CPR, and actively engaged in the demonstrations. Despite the hot weather, instructors continued to promote first aid knowledge throughout the event.



2. The ‘St. John Blood Donation Week 2025’ was held from 25 to 31 May 2025. An Opening Ceremony was held on Sunday, 25 May 2025 at Aw Boon Haw Hall, St. John Tower. Dr. Donald Li Kwok-tung, Association Director and Mr. Dave Yau Shu-fung, Brigade Commissioner were invited as the Officiating Guests. 40 St. John Members donated blood for the event.

3. The “10,000 Miles May Friendship Trek 2025” was held from 19 to 27 July 2025. The theme of this year was “Exploring Chinese Culture”. A total of 32 Officers and Cadets participated in this meaningful trip. In these 9 days, participants visited the Haiyang Oriental Spaceport, museums, enterprises and schools in the cities of Beijing and Shandong.



## 4. China Exchange Programmes 2025

With the aim to promote communication and cultural exchange with the youth and young people in Mainland China, Youth Command organized a Changchun Exchange Programme from 19 to 25 April 2025. 8. The **Commissioner's Shield Competition 2025** was held on Sunday, 26 October 2025 at 7/F, Aw Boon Haw Hall, St. John Tower. More than 70 Officers and Members from Commands formed the Competition Teams to participate in both written and practical tests of the Shield. Hong Kong Island Command won the overall championship.



9. **2025-26 Thematic Subvention for Uniformed Groups (2025-26 年度主題撥款計劃)**

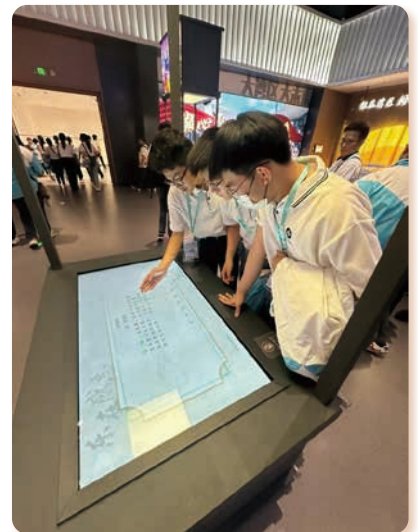
## 10. Brigade Centenary Scholarship 2025

Established in 2017, the Brigade Centenary Scholarship is an award scheme for outstanding Cadets who pursue medical/health care related undergraduate programmes offered by the eight University Grants Committee (UGC)-funded local universities. In 2025, which marked the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Chinese Victory in the War of Resistance, Youth Command organized the “Macao Study Tour” on Saturday, 29 November 2025. Through small groups orientation tour and sharing by corporate representatives, participants explored the customer psychology and marketing strategies, thereby to explore any career plans.

## 14. 'Love Your Teeth' Carnival

With the sponsorship of The Community Chest of Hong Kong, the 'Love Your Teeth' Carnival was held on Sunday, 15 March 2026 at Shek Wu Hui Playground, Sheung Shui, in alignment with World Oral Health Day 2026. The event aimed to raise public awareness of the importance of maintaining good oral health and to facilitate the early identification and intervention of dental care needs. Oral health promoting booths, game booths for children and adolescents, health talks and free basic oral examinations were arranged for members of the public. The carnival was a resounding success with over 3,550 participants from the community.



## 15. The 'Jockey Club Badges: Preparing Tomorrow's Leaders'

The project "Along with St. John" (聖約翰·您的急救之侶) was funded by Hong Kong Jockey Club under the project: Preparing Tomorrow's Leaders since 2023. During the second year of the project, Officers and Cadets reached around 3,200 elderlies at different districts with assistance of concerned stakeholders. Home visits and medical talks by Registered Nurses were held. Cadet Members experienced the communication skills with related training workshops and delivered "gift packs" to the elderlies.

## 16. Publicity in various Local Media & Event

- Employees Retraining Board (ERB) 「職場技能 UpDays」

The Association was invited by the Employees Retraining Board (ERB) to participate in the 「職場技能 UpDays」 on Saturday, 11 October 2025 at Citywalk in Tsuen Wan. The event featured a vibrant mix of on-site recruitment, course enrollment, and workshops showcasing new and diverse professional skills. Representing the Association, St. John lecturers promoted ERB training courses and conducted live demonstrations on infant CPR and choking management.

By showcasing these essential life-saving skills, the activity provided the audience with a clearer understanding of how to respond to emergencies involving unconscious individuals, ultimately fostering greater community interest in first aid training

- TOPick interviewed Ms. Kwan Wai-chi, Training Manager, on the knowledge and skills involved in life-saving techniques. The discussion highlighted practical applications, including a CPR demonstration and the use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

- On Wednesday, 19 November 2025, the Association was invited to the popular program of Metro Radio 《原來生活好快樂》. Ms. Kwan Wai-chi, Training Manager, joined program ambassadors and celebrities Mr. Matthew Ho (何廣沛) and Miss Windy Zhan (詹天文) to discuss the importance of First Aid and to share their personal experiences in learning CPR and the use of Automated External Defibrillators (AED).

- On Tuesday, 2 December 2025, the RTHK program 《醫生與你》 (*Doctor and You*) interviewed Dr. Anthony Kwok Wai-leung, St. John Lecturer, in a segment on fire escape and survival strategies. Dr. Kwok emphasized that “Preparedness is the best prevention”, urging the public to familiarize themselves with fire exit routes and equipment well before an emergency occurs.

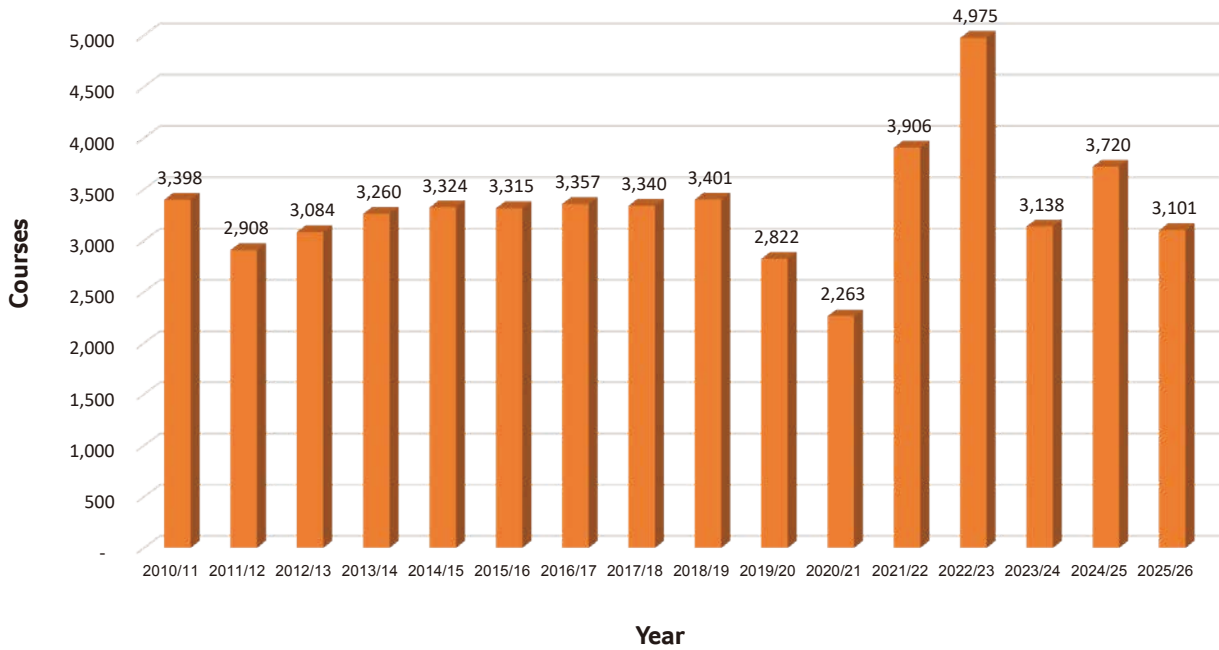

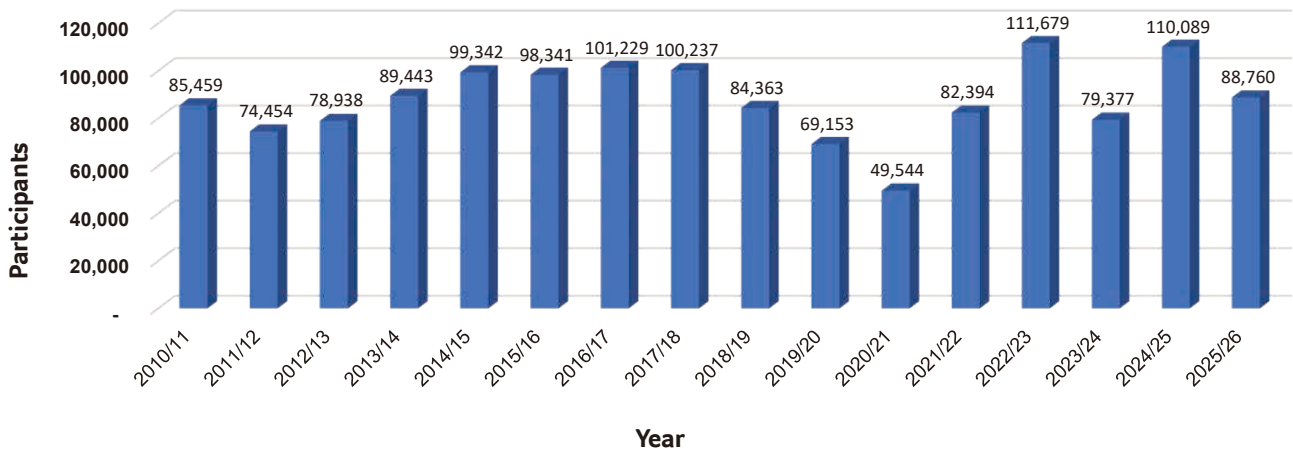

**Total number of Training Courses conducted by the Association (2010 - 2026)**

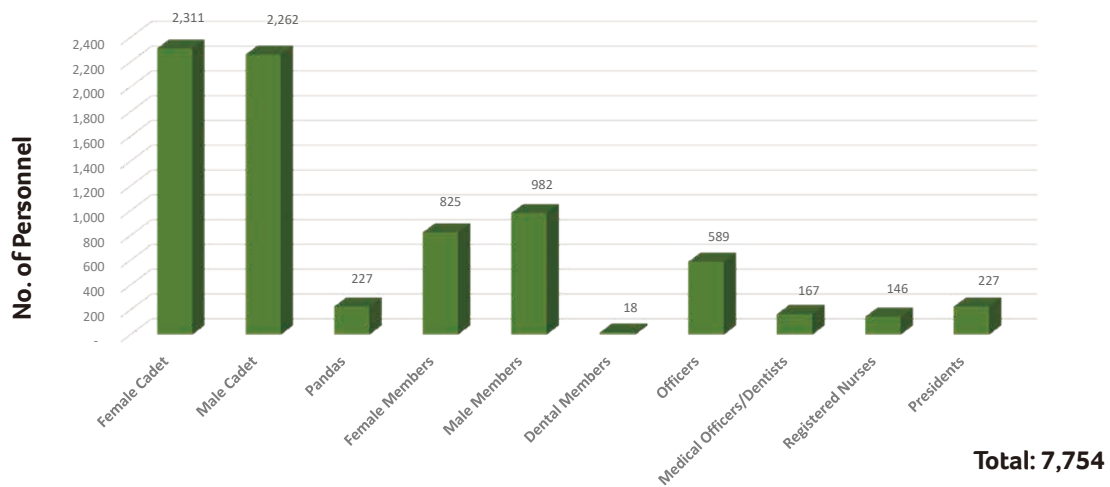


**Total number of participants enrolled in Training Courses conducted during 2010 - 2026**

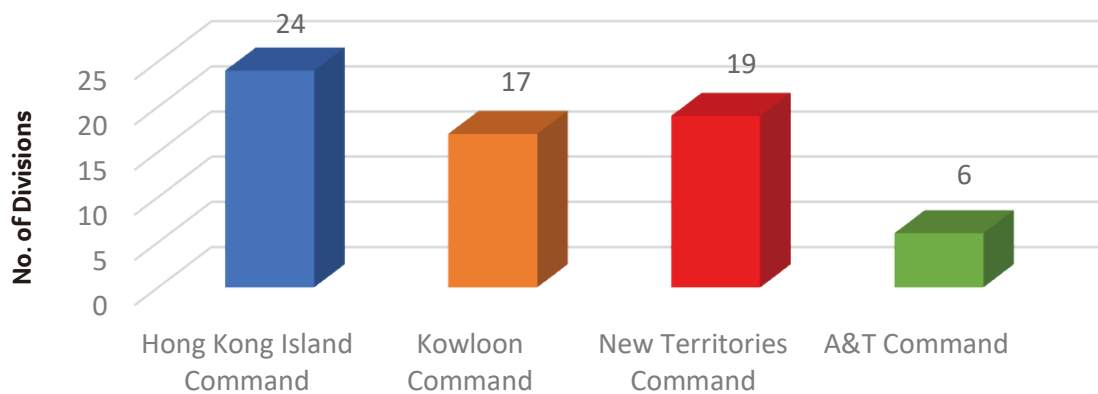

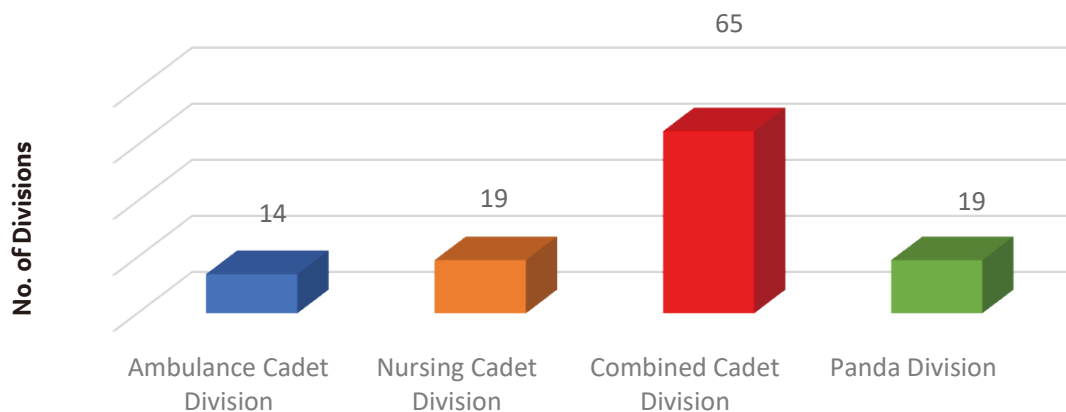
## Strength of the Brigade as at 31 March 2026



## Number of Divisions in the Hong Kong Island / Kowloon / New Territories / Ambulance & Transport Command

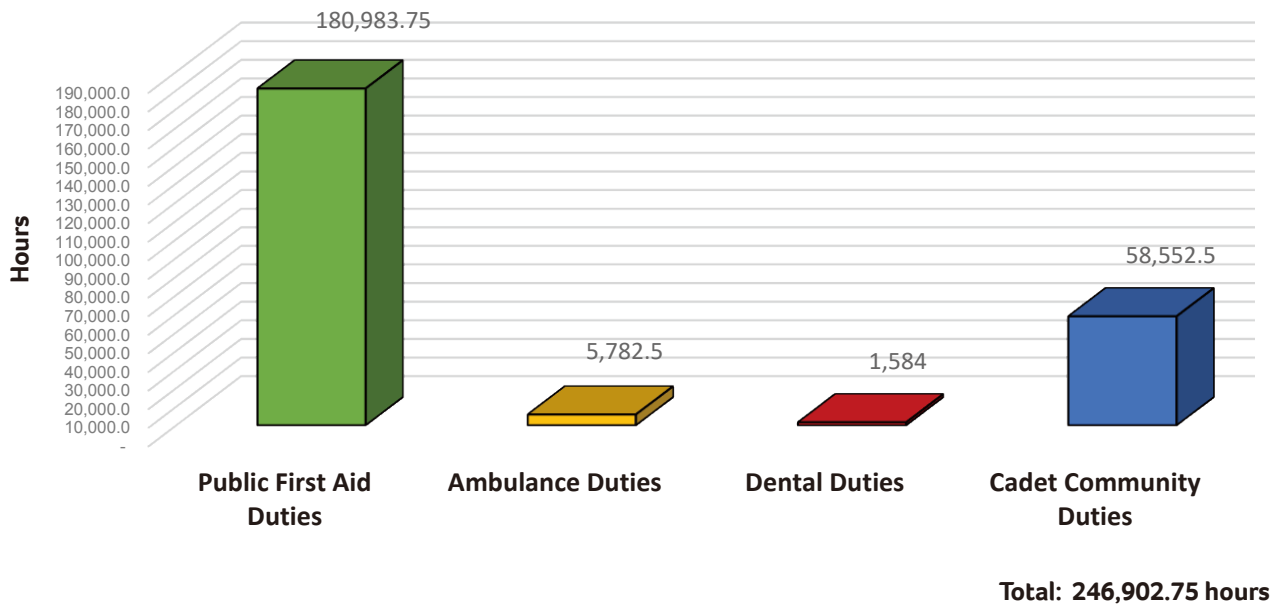


## Number of Divisions in the Youth Command

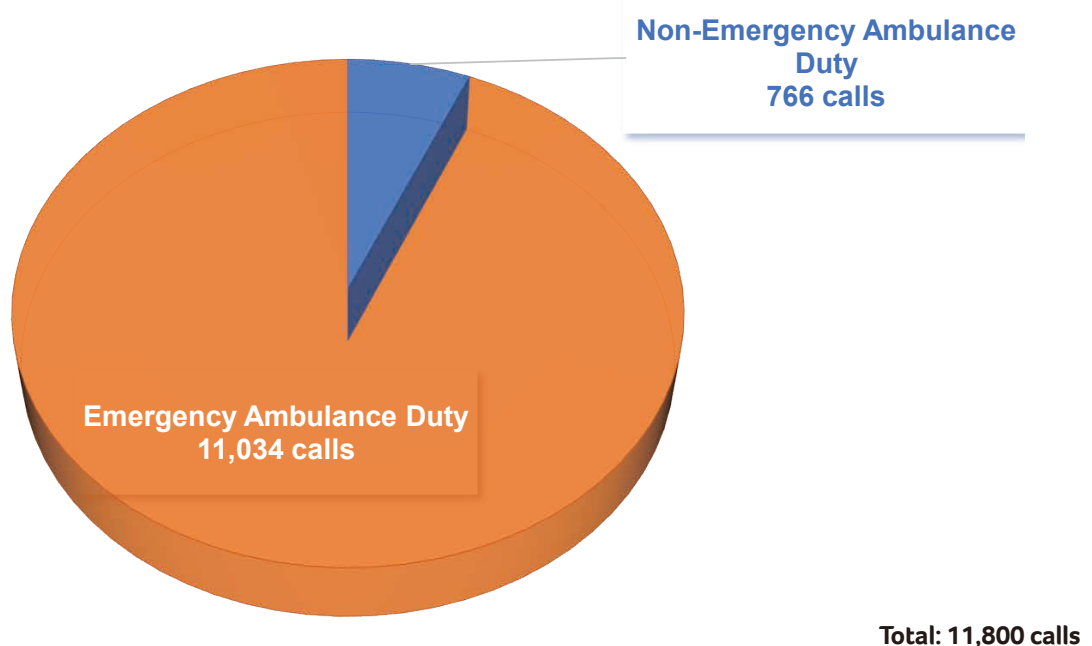
